Tuesday, July 5, 4:00 PM EDT (Zoom) - Lois Berg Stack Beatrix Farrand: Bar Harbor's Famed Garden Designer

Beatrix Farrand (1872-1959) studied plants at Boston's Arnold Arboretum, gained design commissions through her society connections, and became one of the most renowned landscape designers of 20th century America. Through images, visit some of her public and private design projects. Learn about her contributions to landscape design and her efforts to create a horticulture learning facility at her home in Bar Harbor, and learn how the Beatrix Farrand society is working to continue her legacy.

Lois Berg Stack recently retired from the University of Maine, where she worked with Cooperative Extension to deliver educational programs for Maine's nursery/greenhouse/garden center industry and conducted research on the industry's behalf. She also taught classes in horticulture and plant science. Dr. Stack served on the Board of Directors of the Beatrix Farrand Society, and is currently on the Society's Council of Advisors.

Thursday, July 14, 4:00 PM EDT (Zoom) - Ron Romano Maine's Rare "Billboard" Gravestones

Unusual grave markers produced in Maine in the 1800's resembling roadside signs are called 'billboard monuments." Only 42 are known to exist in the state, and we will learn their English origins, structure, and limited production. Each stone tells a story, and we will hear some of them.

Ron Romano is a cemetery historian and author of four books about Maine gravestones and cemeteries. He has managed the daily guided walking tours program in Portland's historic Eastern Cemetery and designed other walking tours of historic cemeteries in southern Maine. Ron is an officer on the national board of *The Association for Gravestone Studies*, the leading organization in America for cemetery studies.

Wednesday, July 20, 10:00 AM EDT (Zoom) Dr. John Kaiser, M.D. Gastrointestinal Diseases

Dr. Kaiser has graciously agreed to return for another of his informative presentations. He will present information about the gastrointestinal tract, from the mouth to the end. **Dr. Kaiser** is a pathologist who attended Dartmouth Medical School and Harvard Medical School and did his pathology residency and melanoma fellowship at the Massachusetts General Hospital. He practiced pathology at Dahl chase Pathology Associates and Eastern Maine Medical Center from 1975 to 2018. Since 2018, Dr. Kaiser has presented very well-received lectures for PVSC on cancer, cardiovascular diseases, and diseases of the nervous system. He has graciously agreed to return again this year to talk about gastrointestinal diseases.

Tuesday, July 26, 4:00 PM EDT (Zoom) - Griffin Dill Ticks in Maine: Information for Personal Protection

Ticks and their associated diseases have become a serious issue in Maine and throughout much of the country. Through this presentation, we will learn about the biology and ecology of the different types of ticks we have in Maine. We will also learn about personal protection and tick management methods to help minimize the risk of encountering ticks.

Griffin Dill manages the Tick Lab within the Diagnostic and Research Laboratory. He coordinates the Integrated Tick Management Program, including the tick identification and tick-borne disease testing services. Griffin also offers support to clients on wildlife-related issues and assists in other Integrated Pest Management (IPM) programs including Potato IPM and Home & Garden IPM programs.

Tuesday, August 2, 4:00 PM EDT (Zoom) – Gregory Gaines Scandinavian Immigration to New England

We will learn the specifics of Scandinavian immigration to New England. While the Mid-West is famously full of Scandinavian-Americans, New England also had a large Scandinavian, particularly Swedish, population in the nineteenth and early twentieth centuries. From Aroostook County all the way down to coastal Connecticut, Scandinavians had a significant cultural impact on New England

Gregory Gaines is a PhD candidate in the history department at UMaine. He studies Scandinavian immigration to the U.S. and ways in which Scandinavian-Americans created a cultural niche for themselves in 19th and 20th century America. He has previously taught a course on Norse Mythology for PVSC, and is excited to be offering more material about Scandinavian immigration and cultural heritage in the United States.

Wednesday, August 10, 4:00 PM EDT (Zoom) – Phil Nadeau Presidential Immigration Authority: The Trump and Biden Administrations

This will be a presentation and discussion about how presidential authority in the Trump and Biden administrations has impacted the lives of many migrants and asylum seekers who are pursuing safety, freedom, and opportunity in the U.S.

Phil Nadeau served as a Maine public administrator for 23 years; adjunct instructor at L-A College in Lewiston and the Muskie Institute in Portland. His refugee and historical research has been published nationally, and he has been interviewed by national and international news media and programs like *HBO Real Sports with Bryant Gumble*. He recently taught a course for PVSC on Refugee Resettlement in Maine and the U.S.

Tuesday, August 16, 4:00 PM EDT (Zoom) – Angela Okafor Unboxing Oneself from the Societal Box

In this presentation we will learn of the struggles, determination, and perseverance that Angela has experienced in her journey that have helped her in confronting cultural and societal limitations through innovative thinking and acting on her own best traits.

Angela Okafor was born, grew up, and was educated in Nigeria before migrating to Bangor. She is the first person of color and immigrant to serve on the Bangor City Council. She is a mother, a lawyer, a board member of the Maine Multicultural Center, a recent MBA graduate, an entrepreneur, a community builder, advocate, a Bangor City Councilor, and the Acting Operations Director of the Permanent Commission on the Status of Racial, Indigenous and Tribal Populations of Maine. Angela has won several awards and honors statewide.

Tuesday, August 23, 4:00 PM EDT (Zoom)—Thomas Garrity, M.S. *Arson and Fire Investigation*

If you were to ask a firefighter why their fire department investigates fires, they would tell you, "It is required by law." Few firefighters understand the important role of fire investigation in community risk reduction. And few fire chiefs utilize fire investigation to reduce or prevent fires. In this class you will learn how Philadelphia used data from fire investigations to develop and implement fire prevention programs to reduce fire injuries and deaths.

Tom Garrity is the Director of the Montgomery County Fire Academy. Prior to accepting the position, Tom served for 36 years with the Philadelphia Fire Department. He is the part-time Coordinator of the Fire Science and Public Safety Administration Program at Holy Family University and is an instructor at both Holy Family University and the Community College of Philadelphia. In 2017 Tom Received the Outstanding Adjunct Faculty award for the Holy Family University School of Business.

Thursday, August 25, 4:00 PM EDT (Zoom)—Meg Gray Bangor Public Library 101: We Have That!

Join Meg Gray, Head of Reference at Bangor Public Library, for an overview of the many services, programs, and resources available at the library. We'll start with an introduction to in-person services including reader's advisory, reference services, genealogy research, and technology instruction, followed by a summary of the e-resources available to patrons, such as Cloud Library, consumer reports, and Great Courses. Finally, we'll review the non-book items that patrons have access to, including a telescope, theatre passes, Wi-Fi hotspots, and more.

Meg Gray is the Head of Reference at Bangor Public Library. Prior to that she was the Science and Technology Librarian at Portland Public Library. Meg grew up in the Bangor area and moved back in August, 2020. In her spare time she likes to read, craft, bike, hike, powerlift, and start never-ending DIY house projects.

Tuesday, September 6, 4:00 PM EDT (Zoom)—Phil Chin Spot a Scam, Stop a Scam

We are targeted daily by an army of people who perpetrate scams on the internet, the phones, and by snail mail. Americans of all ages lose billions of dollars each year. Phil will discuss the tactics and schemes used by these con artists and how to stop them.

Phil Chin has been a volunteer spokesperson for Maine's AARP Fraud Watch Network for the past few years as well as a volunteer instructor for AARP's Safe Driver Program. He retired from CBS News in New York after a 37-year career as a radio news writer and producer.

Tuesday, September 13, 4:00 PM EDT (Zoom)—Karin Tilberg Bringing Permanent Conservation to Maine's North Woods

Forest Society of Maine (FSM) was created in 1984 to serve as the land trust for Maine's twelve million-acre North Woods, the largest block of intact forestland remaining east of the Mississippi. The mission of FSM is to sustain the ecological, recreational, and cultural values of Maine's North Woods while supporting economic vitality and protecting important natural areas. In this presentation we will learn how the members of FSM work to preserve Maine's forests for recreational, environmental, and economic purposes.

Karin Tilberg joined the Forest Society of Maine in 2011 and became the President/CEO in 2017. She brings her decades-long interest in and experience with Maine's North Woods to this position as well as a strong commitment to rural economic health and connecting conservation with community prosperity. She has helped lead FSM's efforts to bring permanent conservation to Maine's North Woods using conservation easements as a primary tool. Karen has a B.S. in wildlife biology from the University of Vermont and a J.D. from the University of Maine School of Law.

Tuesday, September 20, 4:00 PM EDT (Zoom)—Julie Kimball Bangor School Department's Mentoring Program

According to the Bangor School Department's program overview, a mentor is someone who helps to "guide, advise, share knowledge, encourage, teach, motivate, share a common interest, listen and promote success". In this presentation we will learn more about how the program works, who can be a mentor, and the positive impact it aims to create for students from PreK to grade 12 in the Bangor School System.

Julie Kimball is the Mentor Coordinator for the Bangor School Department. In her 23 years in education, she has served in a variety of roles including educational technician, classroom teacher, interventionist, and as a building administrator for the past eleven years.

Meet at the Pine Tree parking: through Gate 1, take dirt road for 0.5 miles

In order to keep our members safe, PVSC has been forced us to forego in-person events for the past two plus years due to COVID. We now have an opportunity to be together outdoors in the relative safety of Nature. We hope you can join us for this field trip to Hirundo Wildlife Refuge.

Hirundo Wildlife Refuge is 2,460 acres of conserved woodlands and wetlands just west of Old Town, Maine. The preserve spans Pushaw and Dead Streams and Lac D'Or, encompassing extensive peat lands, reverting farm lands, flood plain forests, and upland conifer and deciduous forests. Hirundo is dedicated to preserving nature while providing educational and recreational opportunities to the public.

The program will provide PVSC members with a unique opportunity to walk through part of Hirundo Wildlife Refuge on a guided tour. Your instructor will discuss and point out various points of interest at Hirundo, making sure to highlight the animals that live at the Refuge and where they make their homes.

Please bring a bag lunch to eat after the program, which will take approximately 90 minutes. Then you're welcome to explore the seven miles of hiking trails and perhaps spot some of the wildlife in the preserve.

Hirundo charges a fee of \$10.00 per person which will be collected from you on the day of the tour.
